	REGION	LOCATION	YEAR BUILT	POINTS OF INTEREST
Babb's Bridge	MM	Off River Road, northwest of South Windham, between Windham and Gorham, over the Presumpscot River	1843	Burned in 1973 and later rebuilt
Bennett Bridge	MM	Off Rte. 16, west of the grange hall and fire station in Wilsons Mills, over the Magalloway River.	1901	
Hemlock Bridge	MM	Off Rte. 302 in Fryeburg, over an old channel of the Saco River	1857	Paddleford truss construction
Lovejoy Bridge	MM	Off Rte. 5 in South Andover, over the Ellis River.	1883	Maine's shortest bridge; Paddleford truss construction
Low's Bridge	MH	Off Rtes. 6 and 15, northeast of Sangerville, between Sangerville and Guilford, over the Piscataquis River	1857	Carried away by flood in April 1987; rebuilt in 1990
Porter Bridge	MM	Off Rte. 160, between Porter and Parsonsfield, over the Ossipee River	1876	
Robyville Bridge	MH	Off Rte. 15 in Robyville Village (town of Corinth), northwest of Kenduskeag Village over the Kenduskeag Stream	1876	Maine's only completely shingled covered bridge
Sunday River Bridge	MM	Off Rtes. 2 and 26 in Newry, over the Sunday River	1872	Also known as the "Artist's Bridge," because it is so often painted and photographed
Watson Settlement Bridge	AC	Off Rte 1, in Littleton, over the Meduxnekeag Stream	1911	The farthest north and the youngest covered bridge in Maine
